NAG 5 – Health & Safety Policy 5.4

The Board of Trustees and the Proprietor's Board of the Waikato Diocesan School for Girls are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy environment for staff, students, visitors, contractors, and all others who may be affected by our activities. This commitment will be achieved by the following:

- Complying with the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and its regulations, codes of practise and other safety guidance material.
- Waikato Diocesan School for Girls will coordinate, consult, and cooperate with other Persons Conducting a Business or Undertaking (PCBUs) who are in a shared workspace and where there are overlapping duties.
- All staff will be provided with health and safety induction, training, and supervision.
- Staff will be encouraged to engage and participate in health and safety.
- Hazards will be identified and eliminated where possible. If elimination is not possible, hazards will be controlled and monitored.
- Workplace accidents, incidents and near misses will be accurately reported, recorded, and follow-up actions put in place, if required.
- Any notifiable incidents or accidents will be reported to WorkSafe.
- Staff will be supported in an early return to work after illness or injury.
- Ensuring that emergency plans and procedures are in place.
- Committing to continuous improvement in the School's health and safety performance.

While the Board of Trustees and the Proprietor's Board of the Waikato Diocesan School for Girls are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy environment, staff are expected to share in the commitment to this Policy. Staff are expected to play a vital role in maintaining a safe and healthy workplace through:

- Observing all safe work procedures rules and instructions and always practising safe work methods.
- Reporting all incidents, accidents, near misses, pain and discomfort in an accurate and timely manner.
- Actively participating in the identification of hazards and risks and ensuring controls for hazards and risks are effectively implemented.

- Taking part in Health and Safety Forums.
- Following any reasonable instruction given so that the School can comply with the Health and Safety At Work Act 2015 and its regulations.
